NO BROKEN BONES

John 19:31-37 (*Necessary Suffering* #5)

Jesus' bones not being broken is important . . .

- ◆ To signal that He is our Passover sacrifice.

He keeps his bones; not one of them is broken. . . The LORD redeems the life of his servants; none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned. Psalm 34:20, 22

"It shall be eaten in one house; you shall not take any of the flesh outside the house, and you shall not break any of its bones." Exodus 12:46

"They shall leave none of it until morning, nor break any of its bones; according to all the statute for the Passover they shall keep it." Numbers 9:12

"Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" John 1:29 (cf. 1 Corinthians 5:7)

- ◆ To witness to what is true so we will trust in Him.

He who saw it has borne witness—his testimony is true, and he knows that he is telling the truth—that you also may believe. John 19:35

Guinea - 88% Islam; 4.2% Christian

Guinea is one of the poorest countries in West Africa; most of its people live on less than \$1/day. Christians are a small minority. Converts living in border areas are ostracized by Muslim family members. Some have had spouses and children taken away and have been beaten when refusing to recant their faith. Churches have been burned, and Christians told they will be forced into reconversion ceremonies.
