## AROUND THE NAB CONFERENCE



### József Csuahi, Hungary

Rev. József Csuahi is a Community Health Evangelism (CHE) Coordinator for the Hungarian Baptist Union. It is his privilege to introduce CHE's strategies, biblical methods, and sound theology to Baptist churches in Hungary that wish to minister to the Roma people and the poor. With his background as a pastor and former leader of the Baptist Roma Mission, József specializes in evangelism and spiritual training in Misszió az Egészséges Közösségéért's (MEK) community projects and as pastoral advisor to MEK workers. Pray for József as he leads these ministries and impacts the communities around him.

## AROUND THE WORLD

**Algeria** - 0.2% Evangelical Christian; 97.29% Muslim

The pressure Algerian Christians experience in all areas of life makes it difficult for them to openly practice their faith. Intolerance from Muslim relatives and neighbors is a major source of persecution. Laws regulating non-Muslim worship, banning conversion, and prohibiting blasphemy make proselytizing and public expression of the Christian faith dangerous as well. Even casual conversations between friends and family members regarding faith can be grounds for blasphemy charges. Pray specifically that new believers who enter the Church will stand strong in their faith.
