FROM THE PASTOR June was a good break for me. Most of the time we stayed in Jamestown and laid low. I caught up on some much-needed rest. I did some reading and spent time most days outside. I find working in my garden therapeutic.

Over the next few weeks I'll share some thoughts I have about life, specifically the life of those who follow Jesus . . . as illustrated by gardening.

The Bible says, *The LORD God took the man and put him in the Garden of Eden to work (serve) it and take care of (keep) it.*
Genesis 2:15

To serve and to keep are used in other OT references as synonyms for *worship and obey*. Some commentators see a connection between the first man's responsibility of work in terms of worship, i.e. Adam's relationship with God is expressed in his service and keeping the perfect place God made for him. The Garden was the place for worship and obedience, the place to meet with God, the place to labor with Him in His world.

We are reminded many times each day that we live in a world after the Fall. We serve and keep, but not necessarily for the LORD God. Paul says that since Messiah has come, God's creation is in labor, agonizing and expectant, for all things to be restored

and made new (Romans 8:18-25).
Make this month an opportunity to let the Holy Spirit do His renewing and restoring work in you. Take advantage of the picnics (July 14 & 21), the opportunity to discover what God is doing in Japan (Mission Sunday, July 21, with Shan Reed) and celebrate as people testify to God's grace through baptism (July 21).

July is the month for camp at Crystal Springs: Junior (June 30-July 3), Family I (July 4-7), Sr. High (July 8-13), Intermediate (July 15-19), and Family II (July 26-28). **Youth**, make sure you **let the office know you are attending**, if you desire to receive a **scholarship**.
