

The neighborhood is changing.

In 1998 when God led us to purchase this property, the only buildings east of 12<sup>th</sup> Ave. NE from 13<sup>th</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> St NE were the James Valley Current Technology Center and the Seventh Day Adventist Church.

After decades of relatively no population movement, **Jamestown is projected to grow by 7,000 in the next 25 years** with over 2,000 of that estimate in the northeast city quadrant alone. (See "Distribution of LUTP" in *The Jamestown Sun*, June 23, 2015.)

This population growth will impact transportation, child care services, housing, law enforcement, elementary schools and other areas. As a community Jamestown will become **not just larger, but also younger.**

### Lighting the Way Together

- In our neighborhood . . .
- work is proceeding on 200 apartments. Construction on another 400+ will begin soon east of the high school. Do the math on an average of two per apartment.
  - Between JHS and Gussner Elementary a major community recreation center is being planned.
  - The University of Jamestown is in fund-raising mode for updates to the Larson Center, as well as a proposed 2,000+ seat arena directly east of that facility.

**For the foreseeable future the area around TBC will see very little retail or commercial, but significant residential development.**

To ignore or pretend these changes won't affect TBC (and you) would be unwise. More importantly, **if we believe that God is a God of mission at work around us, what does**

**that say about joining Him on that mission?**

Fred Rogers used to sing a song asking, *Please won't you be my neighbor?*

**What will it be like for us to "be a neighbor" to hundreds more residents? How are we practicing community at TBC, among the TBC family and in our neighborhoods? How do these three areas differ and intersect?**

**What has God already given in people and resource gifts? Please join me in prayer . . . and a willingness to serve together with and where He is already at work.**
