

Lighting the Way Together

TO WORSHIP GOD, HELP PEOPLE TO KNOW JESUS CHRIST PERSONALLY, GROW TO BE LIKE HIM, SHOW HIS LOVE, AND GO WHERE HE LEADS . . . TOGETHER.

When we begin to "see", we begin to notice things we haven't seen before. We begin to interact with and know God in a different way. We begin to realize that He is inviting us to join Him in things He is already doing.

At a recent funeral I identified four distinct circles that described the people who were present to support the family. In this case the circles represented those who interacted with the individual's family, recreation, work and church. *Think about your life "circles" as places of influence. How is God working through you to be His light in those places of influence? 
**7 pm, July 31
