# PowerHouse Youth Ministry

Summer is finally here!!! This is a time for us to shake off the scales and extra layers of clothes for a time of freedom/fun in the sun. It is a time to experience the fullness that God offers us; a time to experience true freedom.

Have you ever been put in a situation that is beyond your control? In Matthew 6:25-30, Jesus calls us to a life of simplicity. We are called to be free in Christ. All He asks is that we follow Him. Why do the very things that set us free also hold us hostage?

Throughout the N.T., especially in Paul's writings, we see a recurring theme of sin being compared to chains or shackles. Shackles, (*fetters* in many O.T. passages) refer to forged pieces of iron put around the feet of prisoners. These shackles were usually connected by a small chain and were intended to immobilize a prisoner by restricting his movement. This method was used by guards to control prisoners and provide security for the community. Still in use today, modern shackles resemble a large pair of handcuffs that are placed on the ankles, connected by a small chain and fitting snugly. When the prisoner begins to walk, it becomes painful as the Achilles Tendon begins to flex. If the

shackles are not double locked, they will tighten with each step, causing the grip of the shackles to increase. So what does this have to do with sin? Why did Paul use this term to refer to sin's grasp? This choice of phrasing was not by accident. Paul intentionally chose this illustration to help his readers see sin's power over us and the importance of what Christ did to break these shackles of sin in our lives. From the Garden of Eden to this very day, sin has been Satan's way to trip us up and even enslave us to a way of life that is contrary to what God intended. Sin, like shackles, can grip our lives and limit our direction. The more we try to fight sin in the flesh, the tighter its grip becomes. It is impossible for us to break free on our own.

Inmates can get on a cycle that seems impossible to break. They come to jail for a small crime and are put in shackles. They do their time and are released. For a time they are freed from their shackles. The problem is that shackles, like sin, are designed to be put on and taken off. We choose to sin—allowing those shackles to be put on us. It seems, at times, like the more we try not to sin, the more we do. It is a cycle. Paul said that the things he wanted to do he couldn't; the things that he did not want to do he found himself

doing (Romans 7). The Psalmist talks about shackles being broken (Psalm 2). The only way to render shackles useless is to break them. Unable to do this on our own, we must rely on Christ to break sin's shackles in our lives—setting us free.

Following Christ should be a life of simplicity and freedom, but we make it so complex. My prayer is that we would focus on each day's opportunities as we follow Christ—not missing Him in the midst of life's busyness. He says that if we have the right relationship with him, we will be truly free. If we walk in the truth and light, we will ***be free indeed***. We must do what he called His disciples to do which is to ***simply follow***. Daily consecrate your life and your days to follow Christ on the path of simplicity.
