

FROM THE Senior Pastor
 The last two months have witnessed the most traveling I've ever done--away five out of seven weeks internationally and in two other states for meetings, family and a mission trip.

I shared with some that I've felt a little fuzzy in the body and brain with all the different locations, peoples, airports, foods, meetings, time zones and beds.

The Presence of God.
 Someone has said, *Whenever you arrive someplace new, tell God "Hello", because He's already there.* David writes in Psalm 139, *There is no place I can go apart from His presence.* It's not just that God is everywhere, but that He desires us to experience His presence, to know Him, as Paul writes in Philippians 3.

Skye Jethani shares in the book *With* that people often try to live *over, under, from or for* God, but what God desires is for us to live *with* Him. **How am I opening my heart to God, to experience a life of faith, hope and love . . . life with God?** How am I modeling that kind of life?

The Family of God. We emphasize a relationship with God through Jesus Christ, and rightly so. What we don't sometimes consider is that there is no relationship with God apart from relationship with others who are part of His family. I have brothers and sisters around the world. I am privileged to have met some of them. Some live in great poverty. Some have great joy as His children. Some of these are the same people. We come in all ages, colors, shapes and speak a variety of languages. We have this in common: **we have come to know the Savior and belong to Him by grace through faith.**

The Work of God. We saw God at work reconciling two enemies, drawing a young mother to faith, bringing hope to prisoners and widows. We

heard stories of God's deliverance. We sensed your prayers. Together with you we got to be part of God's work: teaching, preaching, visiting, listening, praying, providing food, discipling tools, soccer balls, print and audio Bibles. **We saw God at work through the CMA staff, through you, in you . . . in us.**

May God . . . equip you with everything good for doing his will, and may he work in us what is pleasing to him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever.

PowerHouse Youth Ministry

The calendar lists the first day of Spring as March 21. I have come to realize that the first day of Spring in North Dakota is not the same as it is in other states. Those dates on the calendar are just suggestions! March is also the season for the NCAA Basketball Tournament (*March Madness*). I like to watch the tournament because every year there is a “No Name Underdog” team that ends up making it to the *Sweet Sixteen* or *Elite 8*. Those teams have tremendous heart and determination. They play for the love of the game and for the hearts of their fans. As humans, we too have a bit of an “underdog” story. God created us to be with him. The world tends to pull us away from God so we must fight to not lose sight of him.

As fallen humans, we often feel like we're missing something, that we're not good enough. The world offers its answers in the form of cosmetic solutions, a new car, a new house or an improved physical feature. But God has a better picture of who you can be: it's one that can't be bought at any price.

We will take our students on a discovery of the conflict between the new life and the old sinful nature in *God's Extreme Makeover*, a 9-part series which will explore the characteristics of the Fruit of the Spirit that each believer begins to demonstrate as God makes them new from the inside out. While our culture tells us to change our outside, God points to the Fruit of the Spirit, and tells us He will change us from the inside.

As a part of this series, we will be having an “Extreme Makeover Competition” to help illustrate what God is doing inside of us by rewarding two students with an “outside” makeover. We hope to have 10 girls and 10 boys compete for a chance to win a Makeover Package (haircut /style, manicure, pedicure, facial and a \$100 gift card for a new outfit). Students will be selected for the competition by completing and turning in an Extreme Makeover Essay. Each week the selected students will compete in some funny and wild games. Each student will receive votes from their friends to keep them in the competition. The girl and boy with the lowest number of votes will be voted off each week. We will reveal the winning boy and girl on Wednesday, April 15, during *PowerSurge*.
