Instead of bright lights, cameras and microphones, there were whips, a crown of thorns and a cross. Instead of *President of the United States*, the title was *King of the Jews*, written on a placard in three languages so all could understand.

As we continue in our Lenten series from Isaiah 52-53, **how is God's word changing you, especially when you consider what the Servant did for you?** I invite you to memorize the selected verse each week.

One way to look at this Isaiah passage is to think of it as follows:

- **52:13-15 - General introduction;**
- **53:1-3 - What we did;**
- **53:4-6 - What He did;**
- **53:7-9 - What "they" did;**
- **53:10-12 - What the LORD did.**

I stand, amazed, in the presence of Jesus the Nazarene and wonder how He

could love me: A Sinner. Condemned. Unclean.

We will conclude with a celebration of baptism on Easter Sunday (March 27). Thank you for continuing to pray for God's people to lead us in the areas of youth and community life.

Where do you see God at work when you look in the mirror? When you look in the community? When you look in the world? What is keeping you from joining Him in what He is already doing? God's mission is truly implausible . . . and incredible!

On his robe and on his thigh he has this name written: KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS. Revelation 19:16

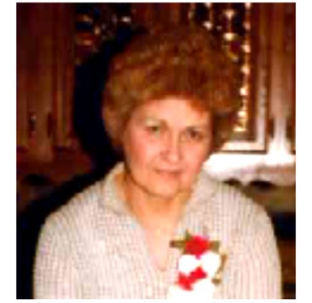

Background: Born in Canada, Ruth moved to Ashley, ND, with her family when she was five years old. She grew up in Ashley, graduated from Ashley High School and moved to Alpina, MI, where she received a two-year certificate in Elementary Education. She met her husband, Vernon, in Ashley, where they both attended the Ashley Baptist Church. During their two-year separation, they wrote letters and visited one another. (Vernon attended auctioneering school in Mason City, Iowa.) After they were married, they lived on a farm near Ashley. Although Ruth wasn't familiar with farming, she discovered that she really enjoyed being a farmer's wife! Vernon passed away in 2010.

Family: Ruth and Vernon raised three children: Their son, David, passed away in October 2014, leaving a wife and three children; Judith lives in Fargo where she is a middle-school teacher (8th graders); Rhoda lives in Jamestown and is employed as the Director of Special Education for Stutsman, Dickey and LaMoure counties. Ruth also has seven grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren. Ruth, herself, was one of seven children.

Vocation: Besides being a farmer's wife, Ruth taught first grade in Ashley for two years and worked at Metropolitan Bank in Ashley for 11 years.

Hobbies: When her daughters were still at home, Ruth enjoyed sewing many of their clothes. She is still an avid reader.

Spiritual Background: At ten years of age Ruth received Jesus Christ as her Savior during revival meetings at the Ashley Baptist Church, where she was later baptized by her father. As a pastor's daughter, she was often called upon to provide special music. She also played the pedal organ and the piano for services. After selling her home in Ashley, she moved to Jamestown and resides at the Heritage Centre. Her ties with the North American Baptist Conference were a significant reason for her to choose to attend TBC.

Did you know?

- Ruth's parents emigrated from Germany directly to Canada. Although they spoke German, they wanted their children to speak English, so English was spoken in their home.
- Rev. Luebeck, Ruth's father, was also an accomplished musician. He played the pipe organ in Winnipeg, and taught Ruth how to play the piano. He also gave free piano lessons to anyone who was interested--having as many as 30 students!
