A ONE ANOTHER WARNING

(One Another #4)

- ◆ Speaking against others reveals what is inside us.
- ◆ When we judge, we imply God isn't doing His job.

Do not speak evil against one another, brothers. The one who speaks against a brother or judges his brother, speaks evil against the law and judges the law. But if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. There is only one lawgiver and judge, he who is able to save and destroy. But who are you to judge your neighbor? James 4:11-12

- ◆ Condemning places unintentional and intentional obstacles causing others to "stumble".

Therefore let us not pass judgment on one another any longer, but rather decide never to put a stumbling block or hindrance in the way of a brother. Romans 14:13

There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. Romans 8:1

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. James 4:7, 8 (cf. Matthew 7:1-12)

When considering correcting another . . .

1. Be absolutely sure of the sin.
2. Only those living and working in God's divine power should do so.
3. The goal is restoration.
4. Realize you could also be "caught" in this or something worse.

NEXT STEPS: Read Leviticus 19:1-18 and Matthew 7 aloud twice slowly. Review the outline. Discuss the difference between judging and discernment in this context. Share what you sense is God's next step for you. Pray for each other, thanking God that Jesus took upon Himself our condemnation so that we can be restored to God and each other.

Bonus: read James, especially chapters 2-4.

Colombia - 2.7% Non-religious; 94% Christianity
 Parliamentary groups and guerilla rebels view Christians as a threat to their movement. In FARC-controlled areas (red zones), guerrillas have killed Christians and made it difficult for them to evangelize or meet for worship. Pastors and other Christian leaders are targets of harassment, assault, and murder. Fear of retribution has caused many Christian leaders to refrain from seeking governmental protection.
