Why would you exchange a noble inheritance for a pedestrian life? Why would you measure your worth through a dimly lit mirror provided by this world? It would have been easy for them to get side tracked with all the miracles, teaching and healing they had observed, but Jesus never lost His focus. We see this in its truest form in John 18:23. Jesus told His disciples that he had to go to Jerusalem to complete His mission. He told them that He was going there to die. This was the plan that was set in place before the foundation of the world. It was the plan God would use to redeem mankind. We must be “On Mission” also. The same mission that empowered Christ should drive our lives. Are you “On Mission”? Where is your Mission Field?


