ONE ANOTHER: IT BEGINS WITH OUR ATTITUDE

- ◆ God receives the glory when we welcome each other as Christ does us.

Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. Romans 15:7

- ◆ God uses our peace with one another as a sign of His kingdom. *Be at peace with one another. Mark 9:50*

- ◆ We belong to one another.

So we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another. Romans 12:5

- ◆ Fellowship with one another is a sign of our walking in God's light. *If we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. 1 John 1:7*

- ◆ Loving each other as God's family goes together with devotion. *Love one another with brotherly affection. Romans 12:10a*

- ◆ Go out of your way to honor one another. *Outdo one another in showing honor. Romans 12:10b*

- ◆ We encourage and build up one another because we live with Christ, whether dead or alive.

Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing. 1 Thessalonians 5:11

- ◆ Caring for one another becomes our focus, not division.

- ◆ Loving one another demonstrates we are followers of Jesus.

North Korea - 98.5% Juche; 1.5% Christianity
North Korea remains one of the most oppressive regimes in the world and is among the worst violators of human rights. The state religion of Juche requires absolute obedience to the Kim family. Those who engage in Christian activities are subject to arrest, torture, imprisonment, and sometimes execution. Those sent to labor camps are forced to work long hours with little food, water, or rest. Though the country boasts of its churches, they are used mainly for propaganda purposes.
